In Memory of Carla Retell Haupt

Carla Retell Haupt Golden Oaks Golden Retrievers 12/30/1961 – 11/7/2015

The Golden Retriever world has added another star in the sky, its name is Carla Retell Haupt. She bred Golden Retrievers under the kennel name of Golden Oaks. She fought hard, but lost her battle with Ovarian Cancer.

For those of you who never met her, you would have found a quiet and calm person who rarely talked until you got to know her. She was more of a listener. Once you got to know her and became your friend, you had someone who would watch your back and be there for you whenever you needed her, whether you asked or not.

She became involved in Goldens in the early eighties with her first Golden named Sadie. Sadie was a wonderful pet that got her a little more involved in obedience than she had been with her little black lab that she started classes with at Southern Michigan. Sadie got her CD but health issues stopped her from going any further than that.

Getting bit by the golden bug, she acquired a new little girl, Dani. Golden Oaks Autumn Sunset CDX JH OD in 1984. Dani steered her on a path she didn't even know she wanted. By getting Dani and relocating her training to another club, she met Linda Brady, who owned Dani's half sister. They trained together and became good friends and through this meeting and friendship, she met her future husband, Dave Haupt in June 1989.... Of course the introduction would be because of a mutual interest in a litter of fluffy goldens that Dave would fall in love with and also become best friends with Carla and eventually fall in love with her too !



Carla did not breed very often, she limited her breeding to only breeding when she felt she had found the perfect sire for Dani. Her first litter was born January 5, 1988. The first puppy born of her first litter was a big strong male that would become Am/Can Ch Golden Oaks Knock Em Dead Am/Can/UKC CDX, JH OS aka Raider to his family, friends and admirers ! Raider was her heart dog. They adored each other. He did everything for her out of the love in his big heart that he had for her. His legacy still continues to this day in his kids, grandkids and great grandkids. He was Carla's "first" in so many ways, first litter, first born, first male, first Champion.

Dani went on to have 2 more litters, with each litter the pups went to the best homes. Some pets, some performance. In the meantime Raider was growing up and becoming quite the handsome male and was being used for stud service. He was the sire of many OTCH dogs, Service Dogs, Hall of Fame dogs and obedience and agility titles dogs.

Her ties to Dave would become even stronger when Dave's dog, OTCH Starburst's Can Do, in 1994, would be the dam of Carla's next golden, Starburst Gldn Oaks Raz-Ma-Taz CDX MX MXJ OAP OJP aka Taz. Carla was there to help with the birth of this wonderful dog and help raise the puppies and teach them how to pull hair ! That was her specialty !

Of all the litters sired by Raider, Carla only kept one dog out of Raider and Meadowpond Simply Joyful . That would be a male, MACH Meadowpond Gldn Oaks Wild West AJP AXP aka Carson. He looked and acted so much like Raider from the day he was born... he was meant to be her dog. Carson would become her first MACH dog and make agility her favorite sport.

Carla loved training in obedience and rarely missed even a week of obedience classes with all of her dogs. She co-owned Chatter aka MACH4 PACH3 Starburst's If Only CDX RE OD with Linda and although Linda titled Chatters to her first MACH, CDX and RE, Carla insisted that the dam of her next puppy would continue to show! So Carla put on all the other titles! Occasionally letting someone else run her like Megan Durocher! Carla and Megan – Chatters two favorite people. Carla adored Megan although she would show it very much and would give her a

> hard time when she wanted to run Chatter at a show. Her favorite answer to Megan's "Can I run Chatter?" would be "I will think about it". Then say yes.

about it". Then say yes. Carla co-bred Chatters first litter in 2009 and kept another girl , Tater, MACH3 Starburst Gldn Oaks It's Outta Here BN MXG MJC OAP NJP T2B4 . Carla titled Tater to her first MACH. Kim Salyers finished Tater's MACH2 as Carla was recuperating from her surgery. After her surgery she got back to running Tater again and had plans to get Tater into the obedience ring this year since she is trained through Utility but she wanted to finish up her MACH 3. She ran her for the majority of her points and QQ's but she could not finish running her for the final points so the agility village took over and Carla then handed the leash over to Megan Durocher.

Even though she could not run her dog, she enjoyed every second of the Megan and Tater team run for that MACH 3.

Carla, always thinking ahead, collected and had stored Raiders semen! She was so grateful to Nancy Chapman who decided to use Raider to sire a litter born in January 2013. Another little Raider was born ... Autumn Grove Gldn Oak Back from the Dead AJP AXP aka Walker. During this last year she had started running Walker in agility along with his weekly obedience classes. He is trained through Open and she had hoped to start showing him along with Tater, but as much as she loved training obedience, she loved running agility even more. She ran Walker through Novice and most of Open when Linda took over and finished his AXP and AJP as she watched from the ring crew table at the Golden Retriever Club of America Nationals in Ohio this year. YES !, even though she could not walk very far or run her dogs – she worked the table, every day, for almost the full day !!! That was Carla ! Always giving and never asking for anything in return.

All along the way, there was one very important person standing by her side, her best friend from the day she met him back in 1989, Dave Haupt. They traveled everywhere together for 26 years! Dog shows, vacations, dinners, shopping, it was always Dave and Carla. She stood by him through thick and thin and never gave up the dream they would find their "happily ever after". They finally tied the knot in

June 2004. With their goldens at their side, along with their family and "dog friends" who watched them go from friends to best friends to husband and wife. It was the happiest day in her life. (and ours!)

In her fight to beat Ovarian Cancer she fooled a lot of people, who thought for a long time that she had beat it. She was tough and never wanted sympathy, but when the word got out, she found that she had many supporters from all the training clubs, breed clubs and training classes. From the Turn the Village Teal walk in Rochester where everyone walked and help raise over \$8000 to help find a cure for ovarian cancer, to the agility trials where everyone wore "Carla's Canine Crew" teal shirts to show their support....and still do!. She will be missed and remembered at every agility trial from now on.





The dog world has lost a very special person. There are hundreds of words to describe Carla. Just a few--- kind, thoughtful, helpful, considerate, a work horse, loving, caring, quiet - unless you did something to one of the dogs !, a true friend, but most of all -- SPECIAL and LOVED by so many people and she will be missed and remembered for many, many, many years by many, many, many people. Whether it was lifting sand bags, teaching a class, exercising a dog, running an agility trial – she was there, quietly doing what needed to be done and never complaining. The world would be a much better place with more people like Carla Haupt!

But for now, as it was said at her funeral ... "she found a door and opened it and it was a path filled with puppies and dogs and knowing that Carla needs things to do, she has a new job, playing with all our dogs that we have sent ahead of us and they couldn't have a better best friend and trainer". They couldn't be in better hands !
