#### November's Speaker



### Patrick Glidden, DVM of Lakeville Animal Clinic

Dr. Patrick Glidden is a 1993 graduate of Michigan State University and Studied at Parker University for Animal Chiropractic. He is certified in Animal Chiropractic by the Animal Chiropractic Certification Commission (ACCC) of the American Veterinary Chiropractic Association (AVCA). Special interests include shelter work, wildlife/exotic rescue, soft tissue surgery, and community education. Dr. Glidden shares his clinic with his cat Raferty, too many fish, and several rescue lizards.

Veterinary chiropractic is a drug-free approach to pet health care and pain relief. In concert with conventional veterinary care, the complementary use of veterinary chiropractic is primarily used for common neuromusculoskeletal conditions. These conditions may include back pain, trouble getting up from a laying position, difficulty navigating stairs, loss of strength or coordination in the rear end and decreased performance in agility trials. By using a chiropractic adjustment, the ability of a joint to move is improved. Improved motion can decrease pain and discomfort as well as improve nerve conduction to and from the brain. Any system in the body that relies on the brain to control its function can benefit from having improved nerve function.

Dr. Patrick Glidden is certified in Veterinary Chiropractic through the Animal Chiropractic Certification Commission (ACCC) of the American Veterinary Chiropractic Association (AVCA). In order to become ACCC/AVCA certified in animal chiropractic a graduate from one of the accredited programs must pass both the ACCC Comprehensive Written and Clinical Competency Examination. An AVCA certified doctor is required to have at least 30 hours of continuing education every 3 years to maintain certification.

On Saturday and Sunday morning Denise examines canine Drives and Motivation in depth. Focusing on food, prey, hunt, and pack drives, participants will gain an understanding of their dogs' behavior and how to apply this knowledge to motivate their canine companion. Participants will learn games and exercises utilizing drives to produce a canine partner that is highly enthused, focused and eager to perform. The partnership between Handler and Dog is enhanced through these exercises and skills. This workshop is highly recommended for handlers involved in any type of competitive dog sport.

Sunday afternoon Denise introduces classes to overcome the anxiety of obedience trials in **Dog Show**Prep and Ring Comfort Prep. Dog Show Prep is a series of classes based on 5 specific goals which
enable teams to feel better about attending an obedience trial. An actual class is run in the workshop
with participant dogs. Ring Comfort Prep focuses on minimizing stress inside a formal obedience ring.

At the end of these classes participants will have the information needed to effectively organize and
host a Dog Show or Ring Prep class. Excellent workshop for obedience instructors!

#### About Denise:

Denise does more than teach you to train your dog in specific exercises. She teaches you to understand the work from your dog's point of view, so you become a problem solver for your dog. She places special emphasis on handler body mechanics in teaching, to assist the handler in communicating expectations while teaching the dog to self-correct without verbal or leash help.

#### Holiday Reminder - Food Safety and Dogs

### that can kill your dog.



#### Turkey Skin

High fat foods, like that delicious turkey skin, can be extremely hazardous to your dog's health. The skin holds any marinade, spices, butter and oils and is difficult to digest. High fat foods can lead to pancreatitis. Symptoms include vomiting,



#### **Cooked Bones**

Cooked turkey and ham bones are NOT safe for dogs. They can splinter in the dog's digestive tract and your holiday may include a pricey trip to the emergency room and worse. Dispose of bones carefully so that your pup isn't tempted to eat them



#### Onions & Garlic

Onions and garlic contain sulfides, which are toxic to dogs, and can lead to anemia. Onions are more toxic than garlic and cooking them does not reduce their toxidity.





Many dogs love the taste of beer, but this does not mean you should share your frosty brew with your best friend. Any alcohol, and particularly the hops in beer, is toxic and in some cases can cause death in dogs.



Specifically walnuts and macadamia nuts and very dangerous for your dog. They could cause a toxic reaction called, "macadamia nut toxicosis." Within 12 hours of eating them, dogs are unable to stand. vomiting, having tremors, fever, weakness and elevated heart rate. Usually symptoms go away but this can lead to deadly shock.



#### Nutmeg

Used to spice sweet potatoes and pumpkin pie, nutmeg can cause seizures and central nervous system problems if your dog ingests it. In extreme cases, it can even cause death. Both sweet potatoes and pumpkin, in moderation, are good for your dog - just make sure they don't have any nutmeg on them before you feed him any!



Sage contains essential oils that can cause stomach upset. Best to keep this herb out of reach from your pup's paws!



#### Chocolate, Dough, & Batter

We all know chocolate is a no-no, but did you know that dough can actually rise inside your dog's stomach, causing bloating and severe pain? Additionally, dough and batter contain raw eggs, which may contain Salmonella. Keep your furkid out of the kitchen while you bake and clean up any spills right awav.
